Dear fellow parishioners,

I don't know about you, but I am ready for the snow to be done. One more freeze would be okay to kill off the bugs, molds, etc., that may survive less harsh winters, so we might have a more pleasant spring and summer.

In the past, I have put out information about what to do regarding Mass attendance in times of weather calamities. I can nearly 100% guarantee that I (or someone) will be at Mass regardless of weather. We will make all humanly possible efforts to ensure that there will be Mass or Communion Service in the regular schedule for both parishes.

If you are unable to make Mass due to illness or there is some weather calamity – don't put yourself or others in danger. Stay in. We usually know when a storm is approaching. Should it happen, find out when a televised Mass is offered and attend it. Don't have coffee or do other things during the celebration – treat it as Church! The purpose of a televised Mass ministry is for those who are homebound and unable to attend Mass with a community. Note: this option is not to be taken advantage of regularly for those who *really are mobile and can get out*.

If you cannot possibly find a Mass time, or if while traveling it may be impossible to attend Mass (as you prepare other things for travel, seek out places and times where Mass is held where you will be visiting) – then prepare to take copies of the Sunday readings (or-use your phone...) and spend at least one half hour reading the Scriptures and pondering them. In addition, offer a Rosary for the intention of thanksgiving for your faith. Daily Mass readings are available in many Catholic sites, I suggest specifically www.usccb.org, the website for the United States Council of Catholic Bishops.

If you can't get the readings or things go terribly wrong, you have forgotten the sheets, etc., most hotels have Bibles in them (thanks to the Gideons) so take a passage from the Old Testament, then one of the Psalms, then a passage from each of the New Testament and a Gospel. If you can't do that, then offer a Rosary and spend the remaining at least half hour in prayer.

In last week's Pastor's Column, I wrote of how we all have to be part of the community either together or apart – again, based on last week's passage from St. Paul. He brings that point home *again this week*. I urge/challenge you to re-read this passage again at least once this week at home (1 Corinthians 12:12-30). Ponder it because *you are a part of the Body of Christ*. Each one of us *must take up our part* in participating with the Body as St. Paul says: "Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it." We need you to be part of the Body! *Really need!*

Let us pray for each other – know that you are in mine always.

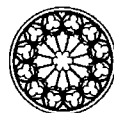
Four Chaplains Sunday

The first Sunday in the month of February is designated as "Four Chaplains Sunday" honoring the four Chaplains who gave their lives that others would live. On February 3, 1943 a German submarine in the North Atlantic torpedoed the USS Dorchester. On board were four Chaplains: a rabbi, a priest and two ministers. The testimony of survivors tell us that the sole order and the only fragment of hope in this chaos came from the four Chaplains, who tried to calm the frightened, tend the wounded and calmly guided men to their boat stations. They distributed lifejackets and then coaxed men, frozen with fear, over the side. As the supply of lifejackets exhausted, the four Chaplains either gave away or forced upon other young men their own lifejackets. These four men of God had given away their only means of saving themselves in order to save others. For all Chaplains serving with our Armed Services, may God be with them and give them strength that only He can provide. For this we pray.

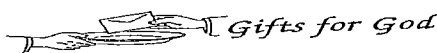

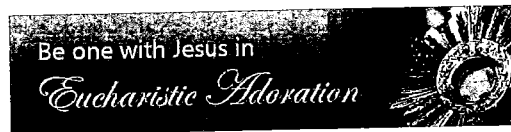
