Dear fellow parishioners, this weekend we celebrate the birth of the Church. Today, 50 days after Easter, the Holy Spirit descended upon the gathered disciples. This was also the time of *Shavuot* (Feast of Weeks) in Jerusalem.

How do these two things come together? Well... "Shavuot" or "Feast of Weeks" was commanded of the Jews by God in Leviticus 23:15-16, to count seven full weeks (or 49 days) beginning on the second day of Passover, and

then present offerings of new grain to the Lord as a lasting ordinance. The term *Pentecost* derives from the Greek word meaning "fifty." Pentecost is celebrated on the fiftieth day after Passover, or the sixth day of the Hebrew month of Sivan, which corresponds with May or June.

Shavuot was one of the three pilgrimage festivals of ancient Israel, when Israelite males were commanded to appear before God in Jerusalem which combines two major religious observances. First is the grain harvest of the early summer and the second is giving of the Torah (Jewish law) on Mount Sinai seven weeks after the exodus from Egypt. The first part determines the ritual for the holiday: giving thanks for God blessing of the harvest the "bikkurim" or "first fruits" (wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives and dates) were selected by the farmer/presenter at their "budding" and offered to God as a sacrifice.

The second determines the significance of the holy day for Judaism, when God entered yet again into a covenant with Israel and giving the of the Divine Law, which can be taken down as Jesus said: "to love God first and all others as yourself." The celebration in modern times focuses on the giving of the Ten Commandments and bears the name *Matin Torah* or "giving of the Law."

So, for us, what does this mean? A parallel... Pentecost is 50 days after Easter when Christ, the "first fruit," rose from the tomb, the "first born from the dead." After helping to grow the disciples for those 49 days, He gave them the new Divine Law then gave them the Holy Spirit and the "gifts and fruits" of Him (God the Holy Spirit that is). The Law is given especially to spread the truth and we take it on "pilgrimage" out to the world as did the Apostles. Remember, last week I said we are the Apostles of today with the Mission to spread God's love, good news and peace.

So, what are you offering to God as your "first fruits?" They don't have to be the ones of the harvest mentioned above. But what is first in your life? What should God have *first*? Are you truly honest in what they are? Will you give them to Him? Consider what He gave you... His live, salvation and eternal life...

Let us pray for each other this week. Know that you are in mine always. I do mean always – part of my "first fruits" for you.




